

Financial Implications of your progression: UK/EU students

1) First year students wishing to start a new degree course from scratch in October 2016

Students wishing to start a new course at Middlesex or elsewhere should be aware that there will be no increase in the fee charge next year. The maximum fee that Middlesex or any other university can charge remains at £9,000. If you would like to discuss any future funding entitlement please make an appointment to see the Student Welfare Advice Team (SWAT).

2) Any students repeating on a full-time or part time basis

Students repeating on a full-time or part-time basis should be eligible to repeat with fee support, maintenance loans and grants **if it is the first time you are repeating**. Students who have previously repeated some of their course may not be entitled to a fee loan or the maintenance grant. Check with the Student Welfare Advice Team. If you are repeating due to extenuating circumstances, for example ill health, you should also seek advice from the Student Welfare Advice Team.

3) Continuing and final year students who commenced their studies prior to September 2006 repeating on a part time or full-time basis

Students repeating on a part-time/full-time basis, or those required to make up a credit deficit on a part-time basis, are unlikely to receive fee support. However, do check, as this will depend upon your personal circumstances and how many years funding you have already received. Seek advice from the Student Welfare Advice Team.

4) Students who choose to change their mode of study in September 2016

Students who choose to change their mode of study from PT to FT or FTDL to FT will be treated as 2016 Cohort students and therefore entitled to 2016 funding. This will entitle them to the new rate of Maintenance Loan, but no Maintenance Grant.

Note: If a student changes their mode of study for medical reasons they will remain on a full time course and receive funding as a FT 2012 cohort student.

Implications of your progression for students from outside Europe

If your status as a student has changed as a result of your progression decision, this is likely to have implications for your student visa and fee liability. For information regarding your visa please make an appointment with one of the Visa and Immigration Advisers through the Library Helpdesk. For information regarding your fee liability contact Student Fees and Finance in the Sheppard Library, ground floor.

Please seek advice from the Student Welfare Advice Team if you are unclear about your individual funding entitlement or your progression options. Appointments to see the Welfare Team can be made through UniHub or the Helpdesk.
