



Photography editors - photographers for events, tracks calendars to make sure virtual events are photographed, edits them, makes sure no photo is used more than once.


Copy writers - brainstorm ideas and coverage concepts for the spreads, write captions and headlines for assigned spreads, spell checks and proofreads.




WELLBEING & FIKA SEMINARS





TIPS AND TRICKS

HOW TO USE NEWROW

Due to COVID-19, we've all had to adapt to using various different online platforms in replacement of in-person events/lessons etc. Even after 2 years of online learning, I'm still discovering so many new online platforms that would be so useful in my work as an SLA and as a student also! Therefore, in this section of the newsletter, we will be going through tips and tricks of various online platforms that may be useful for you in your field of work. We hope this can be useful for even one of you guys! 1. When using NewRow, you do not need the app or a NewRow account to join sessions. This can be super useful when you are hosting events/lessons that may need easy access to a wide range of people. As a guest, you only need to enter your name and email address.



- 2. The 'Shared Notes' features allows participants to see and share each other's notes which allows for collaboration in both meetings with other students and within the classroom!
- 3. You can share up to 25 webcams at once which may sound like an excessive number but can be super useful when you're required to share your work in a class or would like to see each other's screen to collaborate!






- 4. You can also share YouTube videos for synchronous playback on Kaltura Newrow as well as making a playlist to organize live class content which will make playing videos in classes/meetings much more seamless!
- 5. There are also several features similar to Zoom such as using the whiteboard, recording your live classes, using the whiteboard and annotation feature, using polls and quizzes, share files through the chat and many more!
