


Jitsi Guide for Windows 10 and Mac

Jitsi is a multi-platform video conferencing application that can be used on your web browser. No installation or sign in required.


Step 1: From Google Chrome, Firefox or Safari web browser go to the link below and click on **START A CALL**.

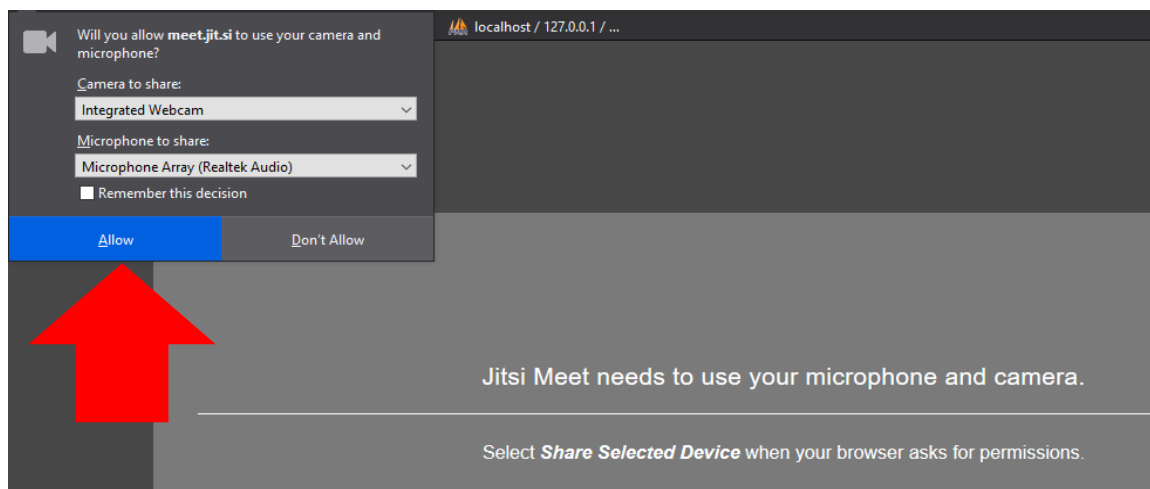

Step 2: Start a new meeting by typing the meeting name/title and then click on **'GO'**
