When and what is the KiA Lab

The KiA Lab – Global Challenge Initiative will take place on **6-8 of July**, immediately after the Postgraduate Researchers' Summer Conference. The KiA Lab is an event designed and led by the Chair for Postgraduate Research, Prof Vida Midgelow, the Theme Directors and our colleagues in Middlesex Dubai. The aim of the event is to bring together researchers of all levels (research students, early career researchers and supervisors) to use the knowledge from their research in application to global current problems. There will be prominent external speakers who will set provocations at the start of the event, delivering the problems that attendees will then work in small groups to address, and inspiration talks will be delivered setting the tone for the proceedings. There will also be workshops and guided small-group working slots and many opportunities to network, socialise with other researchers and colleagues.

What is the MDX Summer Research Festival and what will you gain from attending?

The MDX Summer Research Festival is an event established in 2023, transforming our traditional Research Summer Conference, into a week dedicated to research that will offer attendees a space to exchange knowledge and practice, applicable to real world problems. It is envisaged as a space for knowledge exchange and collaboration, where figures of the public space working in fields that interest deeply Middlesex researchers, will share their experiences and insights from their work, encouraging researchers to think ahead, change perspective, examine and reflect on how their work creates impact in society and the world. The Summer Festival consists of the

Postgraduate Researchers' Summer Conference and the Global Challenge Initiative: Knowledge into Action Lab.

• Can I present remotely?

We encourage researchers who are presenting in the Summer Conference to attend and present in person this year to strengthen again the spirit of the live Conference. Exceptionally, researchers who cannot attend in person (mainly because they live and study abroad, our colleagues and students from our overseas campuses and partners) will be able to join remotely (live, via zoom or other conferencing platform, details to be confirmed).

• Can I participate remotely?

We aim to livestream the keynote addresses and plenary sessions to the extent possible for each event. The parallel sessions and workshops will not be accessible to the audience remotely.

- What are the different types of participation in the Conference:
 Individual Paper Presentation this is an oral presentation of 15-20 minutes followed by discussion and usually accompanied by a visual aid (most commonly PowerPoint slides or PDF, or other presentation software).
 - **Poster** an A1 size poster which is printed and mounted on the designated area on campus (alternatively presented online in an appropriate format).
 - **Self-organised Symposium** a discussion panel on a common topic that is organised by the participants initiative.
 - **Performance** presentation of artistic or other type of work through live performing; with the consent of the attendees it can be participatory.
 - Video screening with commentary.

- **Pre-recorded presentation** if unable to attend (approved by your supervisory team) — this type can also be used in case of exceptional unforeseen circumstances, if a participant cannot attend the conference at the designated time and wish to present their work.

• What is the **theme** of the Conference?

This year the Summer Conference theme is *Radically Creative: Research towards an Equal, Ethical, Inclusive and Sustainable Future*. From the Conference welcome message: "...we invite our postgraduate researcher community to come together in celebration of the potential that research holds to make a difference. Our MDX research community is united by a commitment to generate knowledge that contributes towards fairer, healthier, more prosperous, and sustainable societies. Radical creativity plays a significant role in achieving this goal.... [This year's theme] provides a rich 'somewhere' to collectively dwell upon the potential for research to be bold, creative and impactful". The theme serves to provide a central focus to the Conference, a common topic for all presentations.

Where can I access support for presenting at the Conference?

There is training available for preparing an abstract, preparing a poster and delivering presentations. Links to recordings or to book for upcoming sessions, are available in the Participants' Hub.

• What happens after I submit my abstract?

Your abstract will be reviewed by academics in each subject area and you will hear back from them by the end of May. You will receive feedback on your submission, and in particular if your abstract is rejected. Depending on the quality of your work, the reviewers might recommend that you participate with a different type, e.g. from oral presentation to poster or vice-versa. Your allocated time within the Conference will be announced closer to the date of the event when the programme is confirmed.


How will I participate in the KiA Lab? Do I need to prepare?
